AMID TERROR ON THE SINKING 'DORIA'

AN EPIC SEA RESCUE

At 11:22 p.m. on July 25 in fog and black at Lat. 40:30 N., Long. 69:53 W., a few miles off Nantucket Island, 1.706 human beings abound one of the newest and most splendid vessels man has built came to grips with a crisis as old as man's ventures upon the sea. They were passengers and crew of the sinking Italian liner. Audro Doxia, cruelly hurled from comfort to come face to lace with death.

Inbound for New York, the Doria had collided with the outbound Swedish motorship Sockholm, also quite new and like the Doria equipped with safety devices to prevent such collisions. The blow crippled the Stockholm by crumpling her heavy ice-breaking bow. But it left the Dorie with a mortal hurt, a gash below the bridge 40 feet wide and a third through her vitals. At once the Dorie took a list to starboard so heavy that, as power and radio dimmed, she called desperately for lifeboats because half of her own were useless.

Help came from the Stockhofm, herself hally hurt. Then, as the fog thinsued and searchlights and finally dawn lighted the scene (see over), help also came from every ship within reach of the sentares' unselfish fellowship of the SOS. Indeed, so swiftly and skillfully did help reach Dovi's nightmare of fear, prayer, confusion and canted decks that from her disaster was wrung an epic rescue of the sea.

THE HOURS OF FEAR AS PEOPLE LIVED THEM

It was the last night out, and Miss France Cafiero, a pretty young dress buyer from Nice, wanted the picture taken of her shipksard group at the Captain's Dinner (above) the night before. With two of her friends—Los Angeles Dress Designer Harold Pelix and a young Mexican named Jose Goellen—she headed for the photographic shop on the promenade deck.

The First Class door to the shop was locked
—it was nearly 11:15 p.m.—but Miss Cafero
found an open door near the Cabin Class bar.
She went in to dicker with the cornered attendant, while her friends sat at the bar and
had a nightcap.

In the Tourist bar Thomas Gramigni, a candymaker from Hershey, Pa., was also having a nighteap. Just after 11:21 p.m. he glanced forward and saw through the window something that looked "like a city all lit up."

Giuseppi di Francesco, an ex-florist from Lansdale, Pa., was just going to bed in cabin 128. As he removed his chothes, he too glanned casually out the porthole—and looked again. To him it looked like the lights of another ship heading straight for the Andrea Doria.

In the Belvedere lounge on the beat deek, as First Class passengers danced for the umpteenth time to driveders, Roma, Mrs. Grace McLean of Norfolk, Va. saw the same lights loom through the veranda windows when she looked over her partner's shoulder. Looking out her porthole down below, Miss Frances Aljinavich, a middle-agel bally from Cleveland, quickly sized up the situation for a friend: "Mary, tile going to hit."

Aboard the Sockholm the passengers were still getting accustomed to the ship on their first night out. In a lounge in the bow of the ship sat a group of nine Danish aviation cadets who had completed 15 months NATO training in Canada. One of them looked out the porthole. He shouted, "We're going to crash." The others laurhed.

At that moment the 12,644-ton Stockholm smashed into the Doria's starboard side.

On the promenade deck Dorothy San Felico, out for a breath of air before bedtime, was hurled the whole width of the deck.

"I think we hit an iceberg, like the Titunic,"
Mrs. Richardson Dilworth told her husband, as they picked themselves up from the Boor of
First Class Stateroom No. 30. Mr. Dilworth,
mayor of Philadelphia, assured his wife that
there were no icebergs just off Nantucket. Outside their stateroom smoke and choking oil

fumes were beginning to fill the long corridors.

On Upper Dock the Sockdroin's heavy steel prove had knifed into all the cabins from 36 to 56. In No. 46, Colonel Walter G. Carlin, a Brooklyn politician, was brushing his teeth when the accident happened. Knocked from his feet, he looked to the seaward side of the cabin, where his wife had been reading in bel. There was only a gaping hole—Mrs. Carlin, with the bed and the bulkhead, had fallen into

the sea.

In 54, Joan Ganfarra, 8, daughter of the New York Times Madrid correspondent, was crushed. What happened to her 14-year-0d stepsister. Linda Morgan, was almost impossible to believe. Somehow the tangled wreekage of the Sockholm's prow scooped her up and as the Sewishis hirer backed away the prow carried off Linda—unconscious but alive.

Dr. Peterson got some wire cutters from the radio shake and they managed to cut Mrs. Gamfarra free, except for her ankle. With a board, they pried her completely loose.

As the giant lle de France hove to, the cessation of her machinery awoke some of her passengers. One of them was LIFE Publisher Andrew Heiskell who came awake in the ship's unaccustomed silence believing he heard a faint, far-off swell of human sounds. He arose and, looking out the port-hole, saw the brightly illuminated, deeply listing Doria about half a mile off. Dressing hastily, Heiskell roused Life Photographer Loomis Dean. aboard the *lle* en route to an assignment in Paris. In the following 25th hours, while the *lle*'s lifeboats took off 753 of the *Doria's* survivors, Dean took most of the pictures on these and the following two pages.

Some were angry over lost possessions, others in anguish over missing relatives. And for some there was wild rejoicing when those lost were miraculously found again.




COLD CALAMITY FOR COTTON

ALSACE FURNISHES EVERYTHING FREE FOR ITS FEATHERED FRIENDS

In the French region of Alsace, where storks are cherished as bringers of habies, good luck and tourists, the bies above are taking unblushing advantage of a unsique human boundogde. The birds got their nest without either twig or toil of their own. Instead it was built for them by a human specialist in stork nests as part of a municipal housing project for storks by the town of Rebeavillé. 





teeth, biting it to the bone. The Ranger tried to choke him off, but in vain, and fearing that he might book his temper if the pain continued, he drew his Bowie knife and dover it to the hilt in Manned's heart. wealthy Mexican lady, and lived on respected-by the Mexicans. Of those doomed to the halter vizteen were hanged on the 9th of September at the village of San Angel, on the next day four were hanged at Mixcoac, and on the 13th thirty more were strung up

at the same place, fifty in all!

The execution of the last number was attended with unusual and unwarranted acts of cruelty. The day selected was the one on which the Fortress of Chapultepec was to be stormed, and the gallows was erected on a rising piece of ground in full view of the attack, Col. William S. Harney was selected to carry out the barbarous sentence which was as follows: "To have the men placed on the gallows with ropes around their necks, to remain until the American flag was displayed from the walls of Chapultenec, and then swing them off?

A long beam supported by four uprights formed the gallows, from which dangled thirty lariats. The Patricios were brought out with their arms and legs tied, seated on boards laid across wagons and faced to the rear. The Surgeon informed Harney that one of the thirty men was dying, having lost both legs at Contreras, to which this commissioned Jack Ketch replied: "Bring the I'll do it!", so the dving man was laid on a wagon with the rest.

When the order of execution was read to them these reckless and desperate men, many of them wounded, and covered with dirt and blood-for little care they received-made it the subject of their horrid mirth. One of them said, "If we won't be hung until yer dirty ould rag flies from the Castle, we will live to eat the goose that will fatten on the grass that grows on ver own grave, Colonel." Another exclaimed, "Colonel! Oh Colonel, dear! Will ye grant a favor to a dying man, one of the old Second, a Florida man. Colonel?"

Harney with an oath asked what he wanted when the Irishman replied, "Thanks, thanks Colonel, I knew ye had a kind heart. Please take my dudeen [pipe] out of me pocket, and light it by yer elegant hair, that's all Colonel!" The red-headed Colonel struck the jester a dastard blow on the mouth with his saber hilt. knocking some of his teeth out. As the poor wretch spit out blood he cried out, "Bad luck to ye! Ye have spoilt my smoking entirely, I shan't be able to hold a pipe in my mouth as long as I live!" The battle with varying fortune raged for hours: at length the

walls were gained, and our flag was flung to the breeze from the for the wagons to start up and thirty bodies hung whirling, kicking and rubbing against each other, in a fearful Dance of Death. Such was the miserable end of the Legion of San Patricio.

R UMORS of peace continued to reach us, all through Mexican sources, but it was not until June that we received official notice that a treaty of peace between the United States and Mexico had been signed at Guadalupe [Hidalgo], May 30th, 1848. Cheer after cheer went up from our volunteer camps: hurrals for New Orleans! Hurrah for the United States, and home! All of them were in high glee.

But with the Regulars, the real Uncle Sam's Boys, peace made little difference-we had to serve our time out, peace or war. I myself was enlisted for the duration of the war and was entitled to my discharge. But I concluded to remain with my Squadron. Every effort was made to get the enormous quantities of Ordnance and Quartermasters' Stores out of the country, and the Dragoons were to remain to the last, to see everything off.

I liked Mexico, and had a serious notion to remain in the country, turn Salitidore, hunt down El Tuerto and avenge Carmeleita, and then marry some Senerita rica [rich lady] and return to Boston as Don Samuel Chamberlain, and rejoin the church

But fate, fortune or Providence ordained that my fate should be otherwise. As the last wagon started from our camp at Walnut Springs, we bid adios to the weeping solioritas of San Nicholas, and started down the Camargo road accompanied by hundreds of our fair friends. The next morning we had just reached the Grand Plaza of Marin when a courier came up at a jump and handed Major Rucker a letter. It was an order for the Dragoons

to report back to Monterey and refit for a journey to California! -to us, then, a wholly unknown land. Some of the Dragoons deserted immediately, and most were dissatisfied. But I rejoiced, it promised adventures, and new scenes, and I resolved to go if I had to re-enlist. We returned to our old camp, much to the joy of the women of San Nicholas.

During the war many of these Mexican females proved firm friends of "Las Grissas" and we were often indebted to them for valuable information regarding the movements of the enemy, their own countrymen. But with the coming of peace, and our leaving the country, the position of the "Yankedos"-as the women were called who lived with the Americans-was not a pleasant one. They suffered fearful outrages from the returned Mexican soldiery-they were violated, ears cut off, branded with the letters "U.S.," in some cases impaled by the cowardly fiends who thus wreaked their vengeance on defenceless women.

At Saltillo there were a number of such women who had lived with the Americans. After General Lombardini's Mexican division



reoccupied the town the authorities got up a grand celebration to commemorate the treaty of peace. At midnight the Grand Plaza was ablaze with fireworks, and full of drunken soldiers and ladrange, when a Dominican monk, one Padre Olitze, got up on the fountain in the center of the Plaza and in the most fiery language denounced these poor "Yankedos" to the mob. Yelling like fiends they searched out the miserable creatures, dragged them in their night clothes to the Plaza, where for hours they were subjected to nameless horrors, had their ears cut off, and the finishing stroke (a merciful one) given by cutting their throats. Twenty-three young, lovely, and accomplished señoritas were tortured to death at this time, and no notice was taken of it by General Lombardini, or any one else among the Mexican authorities.

THE expedition intended for New Mexico and California was fitted out at Walnut Springs in the most complete manner. It consisted of A and E Companies, First Dragoons; Companies I, K and L, Second Dragoons, and Bragg's Battery now under Lieutenant Kilburn. Major L. P. Graham was in charge of the cavalry while Brevet Lieut, Colonel John Washington commanded the whole detachment. Our camp was alive with preparations for the long march, wagons were overhauled, tires reset, new horses and mules purchased at Camargo, all drills discontinued and everything done by the officers to make the men satisfied.

All of us who were enlisted for the war were now mustered out and paid off. I felt sorry to part with my old comrades, and I had a strong desire to visit California. I called on my friend Mrs.



lying down now and then, and then staggering toward those craggy peaks which always fled before us. Toward night Soldan stopped and refused to go further. I threw off his saddle, and he fell to the ground with a groan, I raised his head in my lan, crying as if my heart would break—I knew it was my duty to shoot him but my nerve failed me. Spreading over him my blanket I loaded myself down with my arms and went on my solitary way. My tongue was dry, my mouth felt as if full of ashes. Finally I fell down in the darkness and lay like a cornse until morning

Next day the sun was high overhead when I was saluted with a cry like a coyote's and two Indians came in sight from behind a sand drift. Weak and raying as I was, I managed to draw my revolver. But they cried "Amigo! Amigo!" and held up a doubleheaded gourd from which they gave me a long drink of water that seemed full of sulphur. Then they gave me some stinking mule meat and acorns, but I could eat very little.

Using signs I made them understand that Soldan might be saved, and finally one of them went back to look. The other guided me on for several hours until we came to their village. To my great delight I found my three comrades sitting in front of a camplire and getting me up a supper; broiled mule meat, acorn bread and real pure coffee! They told me the place was called « Vallecita (Little Valley) and had the first water after leaving Rio Colorado, 125 miles away. They had arrived some twelve hours ahead of me and sent the "Diggers" back to my rescue

Next day, to my great joy, the Indian came in leading Soldan whom he found following up the trail, Hitchcock, our interpreterengaged two more of the bucks to go back for my saddle, promising them and the man who saved my horse my old ragged red shirt! and this without consulting me, It was my only shirt too! We concluded to remain here several days to recruit our ani-

mals. Two of the Indians agreed to go ahead to the Spanish settlements to purchase a beef for us with a doubloon we gave them for the purpose. They were Christianas and appeared trusty as Indians go. Our animals seemed to relish the coarse wiry grass, and we turned them out to graze without a guard.

On the third day, there being no sign of the Indians we sent for beef, we decided to start for the settlements. After a teclious march of six hours over barren rocky country, we reached the Indian rancheria of San Phillippe, where we found grass and water. Here our Indians met us with two beeves instead of one and we found they had paid only four dollars for both. We killed one, made a good meal of its lean stringy meat, cut off some of the best pieces to pack along, gave the rest to the Indians and the live one to the driver for his trouble.




